From the bottom of my heart and on behalf of all of the RememberUs.org team I would like to thank you for your continuous support!

The past year, 2019, was a very challenging period in our work. We had ambitious goals, but limited funds. However, I am proud to say that this financial hurdle did not derail us. We successfully completed our original planned activities for the year, and were additionally able to finalize several new initiatives that emerged midyear.



While we were not supported by any Jewish organizations this year, we were supported by you individual donors. Your personal contributions funded all 2019 RememberUs.org projects! Your contributions allowed us to partner with several organizations (from the Netherland and Ukraine) to build the Holocaust memorial in Bila Tserkva, create a Holocaust museum at a public school in Mirgorod, restore the Holocaust monument in Khorol, plant new metasequoia trees, research and create two web sites, organize commemoration events, educational events, school trips to Holocaust memorials, and much more!

Together we commemorated Jewish victims of the Holocaust and educated the general public to develop a foundation for #NeverAgain.

RememberUs.org has big plans for 2020, and we hope that with strong support of our individual donors, we will continue contributing to the #NeverAgain mission.

Our Mission

To honor and commemorate those who perished in the Shoah and to educate future generations about the devastating and everlasting consequence of genocide.

WHO – A volunteer-led public charity

We are a group of volunteers bound by a common goal: to prevent future genocides by honoring and commemorating those who perished in the Shoah.

Six years ago, a single project in Kharkov, Ukraine sparked the genesis of our work. Since then we have expanded swiftly, both in size and in our mission. Today we are dually based in the U.S. and Ukraine and have rolled out a series of ground-breaking projects.

WHERE – Operating in the USA, in Ukraine and Israel

Our work is managed across the globe. The bulk of activity is conducted in Ukraine, where we work directly on Holocaust sites and with both Jewish and non-Jewish communities. We meet with survivors, visit mass graves, and host educational activities directly at sites of massacre.

We bring all the knowledge we have retained back to the United States, where we host educational seminars at schools, senior centers, and summer camps.

WHAT – Commemorating victims of the Holocaust and educating people about the everlasting effects of genocide.

Our unique approach distinguishes us from other organizations because we conduct work directly at the sites where the Holocaust events took place. There is a deep distinction between education in a distant classroom and learning directly on location.

We work with communities to learn their stories, speak with witnesses and families of Holocaust victims, host commemorative ceremonies on the land where killings occurred, and connect stories that we have discovered to their roots to create a profoundly stronger impact.

WHY - "If not us, who? If not now, when?" - Hillel the Elder

The Holocaust was one of the most evil, tragic, and deadly chapters of modern human history. At a juncture where anti-Semitism is on the rise, the last survivors of the Holocaust are fading, and knowledge remains limited, it is our moral responsibility to remember, learn, and pass on stories to future generations.

Education and commemoration are two powerful tools, essential in ensuring that never again will such genocide occur. It is our obligation to uncover these stories, commemorate the innocent victims, and teach all generations across the globe to cement the notion that this history must not repeat itself.

The Year at a Glance

We continued supporting all initiatives started in previous five years, and we have expanded our support to new locations. Our most memorable projects and events of 2019 include:

School Museum in Mirgorod 2019 Done 1

The largest project of 2019 was definitely a school museum in Mirgorod, Ukraine. The new museum inside the school #5 is already a focal point in Mirgorod's Shoah education.

Next year, following our Last Mile framework, we plan to organize on-going field trips to the museum and to killing sites in nearby Khorol, Piryatin and Lubny for all the schools in the district.

Memorial in Bila Tserkva 2019 Done Done


Bila Tserkva Massacre took place in August of 1941. Seventy eight years later, in August of 2019 ninty murdered Jewish children were finally commemorated at the newly created <u>Holocaust Memorial for</u> Fallen Jewish Children and Righteous among the Nations.

Several years ago we planted the seed of this project. We helped to manage it and fund it; helped with the city permits and community engagement, helped through implementation and into the opening ceremony. Governor of Kyivs'ka oblast, Chief Rabbi of Ukraine, Chief Rabbi of Holland, state and local officials, pastors and archbishops and hundreds of people attended the opening event.

Education and Commemoration Events

We continued our Boston-area educational events and 2019 was no different.





Each year, we try to organize one large commemoration event at abandoned and/or little known killing site. This year, 2019, first time since the Tragedy, the event was organized near the town of Khorol, Ukraine. Hundreds of people, state and town officials attended, including the Consul of Israel and guests from Germany, Israel and the USA to commemorate Jewish victims.



Planting Metasequoias

Planting metasequoias at the killing sites is our signature activity, and this year was no different. We planted new trees at the killing site in Khorol and re-planted trees, broken by vandals, at the Holocaust memorial near Lubny and replaced one tree at Babin Yar in Kyiv



School trips to killing sites

Since our start in 2014, we have fostered educational programs forthousands of teens, young adults, and teachers, alllowing them to learn the Holocaust history of their own land. For many, these programs represent the first time they have heard these stories.

This year we continued guided bus trips in Kharkiv, Lubny, Kremenchyk, and expanded the program to Fastiv, Bila Tserkva and Mirgorod.






Financial Summary
